## What We've Learned

### Term Three...

**C.J.-** I "learned" Greek this term. I think that sentence is enough right there. ☺ Greek was tough. It used to be taught in two terms but they have now condensed it to just one term. This is why I put learned in quotations, I learned enough to understand the importance in being able to refer to Greek to help in understanding the text. In Life and Teachings of Jesus Two, a Study of Matthew, I learned the fundamentals of discipleship and what true discipleship should look like. We read two different commentaries on Matthew on the side, as well as memorize various passages from Matthew. Alaina and I haven't mentioned that in almost every class throughout this year we've had various loads of memory work. However, the memory work has been beneficial, purposeful, and helpful. It has allowed us to really see the value of having the Word of God written and placed in our hearts. I also took Acts and learned about the works of the Spirit and His influence. Along with reading the book of Acts we read a commentary on the book as well. In Biblical Interpretations we read lots of commentaries and then learned how to look at the scripture and accurately write a commentary.

**Alaina-** I took The New Testament Church this last term. I took it with the Level 2 students so that I wouldn't have such a heavy class load later on with the baby. However, it was such a necessary and essential class that I plan to audit and make it to the class discussions with our Level 1. In this class we learn what the 1<sup>st</sup> Century church looked like and the requirements of being a part of the church and that God adds to the church. Of course, many of the hot topics of today's time were brought up and discussed as well. I also took Effective Parenting. I loved this course. We talked about discipline and the various developmental stages our children go through. We also looked at scripture for the God's Biblical principles in parenting our children as well. It was challenging to take a course like that in the setting that we are presently in. Phrases such as, "Becoming a student of your child," were used repetitively. It's tough to be an actual student of your child when so many other things are going on that require your attention in life, especially if you have more than one. We were reminded of our responsibility as parents to do our best to help our little humans develop a healthy soul. God gifts us with this responsibility and we shouldn't take it lightly.
