

# What We've Learned



We had some phenomenal instructors first term. There is no way we could adequately portray in a newsletter what we've learned and experienced, but we will try to recap. We started Monday and Wednesday mornings with Christian Evidences. We explored how the Bible is a historical book with historical facts. It was amazing to see verses that we typically would skim through without a thought were actually very important in proving the reliability of their testimonies. We even compared how reliable the Bible is in comparison to other historical and famous literary books. We also spent a class period going over the geographical evidences of the earth's actual age and how non-Christian scientists often leave out pieces of information or will fill in the gaps with unproven hypotheses to make the case for evolution. The afternoons consisted of Old Testament History I we studied Genesis, Exodus, and Numbers and reviewed the commands of God. There were a lot of "a-ha" moments where Old Testament information helped in understanding the New Testament interactions. Tuesday and Thursday mornings we learned about the importance of the spiritual graces that God has given us in order to form a relationship with Him. In the afternoons we studied Jesus' life through the book of Luke. In ministry we should follow the footsteps of Jesus and seek out those who are lost and broken. Jesus was found many times communing with those who were outcasts. On Fridays, the men took Introduction to Ministry Studies and studied formatting papers. The women took Gracious Hospitality and learned what it means to be gracious and hospitable to everyone whom we come in contact. They spent the term praying that God would open their eyes to those whose needs they could help meet. While the men were learning about writing papers, the women got to practice skills in the kitchen! However, food was always shared with them. ©
