On Monday 15th August, at the Cumbernauld church building, Maurice baptized Norma Pearson, a retired lady (just) who lives alone but near her daughter. We have been holding weekly classes with Norma since we

Their preparations were for a Sunday afternoon ceremony. Perth is different to all the other congregations in Scotland – we hold our service at

2.30 pm. However, an appeal to three brothers in Christ of the Glenrothes church yielded their happy acceptance to travel up to Perth and conduct the afternoon service there. John Frazer, 'Willie' Stewart and Richard Gilmore were made very welcome and rewarded in the usual way – the ladies provided them with plenty of

goodies.



Our weekly studies continue with our 'rural' brethren and friends. Our drives to places like Newtyle are really beautiful as the trees are just starting to move towards their autumn colours. We have often seen cattle and sheep grazing in a field – with wild deer scattered amongst them. In many places the Grey Squirrel has decimated the ranks of the Red

Squirrel – but there seems to be a haven for the smaller Red Squirrels in a wooded area near a bridge over the River Tay.

At the end of this month we are travelling to South Africa for a two week visit. We will be visiting our triplet granddaughters in Durban - Stewart and Bridget's children. The girls will be twelve years old on 30th October and it seems a 1-o-n-g six years since we have seen them. We will also be attending The Southern Africa Bible College's 50th anniversary lectureship in Benoni - to the east of Johannesburg. It will be wonderful to see and meet up with many of people who were so much part of Maurice's life when he lived in Southern Africa. We will also be responding to an invitation to meet with a small gathering of the Buthelezi family - up in Ulundi, in Zululand. We will be travelling with a west Texan sister in Christ – Vicki Zant – from a well-known farming family of that state.
